Indigent Burial Program

The indigent burial program and application process varies by county. No public assistance program can pre-qualify a decedent or family for this service. Eligibility is generally based on income and assets of both the deceased and the next of kin. Both the deceased and the next of kin must meet the poverty guidelines. Qualified veterans may be buried at the Veteran's Administration National Memorial Cemetery in Arizona.

To initiate a referral for the indigent burial program contact the County Public Fiduciary's Office nearest you for further information.

Legal Service Organizations

Program Description

All legal service agencies provide free help to eligible low-income clients with civil (not criminal) legal problems. They may be able to represent you if your case falls within one of the following categories: government benefits; landlord/tenant issues; Federal housing program disputes; loss of home; divorce; domestic abuse and violence issues; personal safety and the safety of children; child custody; visitation; guardianship of minors, elderly or the incapacitated; bankruptcy; debt collection defense; consumer issues; health issues; civil rights; and Indian law. Remember, not all offices provide help on all of the above listed subjects. You need to contact your local office to see if they will be able to help you.

Eligibility Information

Free legal services are available to U.S. citizens and legal residents whose income falls within the agency's guidelines. Non-legal residents may also be eligible for help. This can be a complex issue and is different in every case, so you should ask your local office if you might be eligible.

How to Apply

Most offices only accept new applications during certain times of the week. These times vary by every office. You should call the office nearest you and ask them when you can apply. Some offices will accept your application over the phone, but you should not count on that. If it is an emergency, such as threat of being evicted in a few days, you should call or visit your local office and explain our timeline for getting help. In some situations, the agency may be able to make an exception and assist you regardless of whether or not they are accepting new applications. Please contact the office directly to inquire in these cases.

Documents Needed

Bring all documents pertaining to the legal problem; also bring proof of U.S. citizenship or immigration status, if applicable. Bring any documents, court papers, leases, summons, petitions, letters, bills, contracts, mortgages, Department of Economic Security denials, termination notices or other relevant papers with you to the scheduled interview. Be prepared to answer questions about your income.

There are free legal service agencies throughout the state for people with low incomes. Contact the office nearest you.

Low-Cost Pet Spay and Neuter Clinics

Low-cost pet spay and neuter clinics provide basic sterilization services to pet owners, with some providing other services including vaccinations and exams. Some clinics also provide services at no cost to low-income clients and for specific animals such as feral cats. Prices can vary widely even in the same city. When discussing prices, be sure to ask whether there are any other charges or fees in addition to the cost to spay or neuter. For example, sometimes a clinic will require that an animal receive a rabies vaccination if it has not already had one. Rabies vaccinations for domestic pets are required by law in Arizona.

Some Counties offer free or low-cost spay and neuter services through their Animal Control office. In some cases, if you are enrolled in a program such as Nutrition Assistance or AHCCCS, you may qualify for a discount on services. Please contact the Animal Control office in your County for more information. The Humane Society is a good resource for both spay/neuters and vaccinations. Voting Information

Elected officials make changes to programs and services based on what they think is important to the people they represent. The **MOST** influential individuals are **REGISTERED VOTERS**. When you register and vote, you send a clear signal to vour elected officials that your needs and opinions are important, and they need to listen to them or you will help elect other officials who will better represent your needs. Many changes are happening to low-income programs and services. It is important for your elected officials to hear what you think. Your voice matters to elected officials... **USE IT! VOTE!!!**

To Register to Vote, You Must:

- be a U.S. citizen
- be a resident of Arizona for 29 days before the day of election
- be 18 years of age or older on or before the day of the next General Election
- have not been convicted of treason or a felony, unless your civil rights have been restored.
- have not been adjudicated or an incapacitated person as defined in A.R. 5101
